The first Olympics was held at Olympia in Greece in 776 B.C. The prestige and glory of the Olympics spread far and wide. With the advent of Christianity the games lost their importance, as it was believed that they encouraged pagan worship in temples built to honor the Greek gods. It was Theodosius I who ordered the total destruction of the Olympia Sanctuary's temples and other structures in the year 394 A.D., which ended the era of the ancient Olympic games.

It was due to the efforts of Baron de Coubertin that the modern Olympics of the modern era began in 1896 and

were held every four years except during the two World Wars.

The International Olympic Committee (IOC) was constituted in 1894. It had 15 representatives including Coubertin. The first Olympic medal was won by America's James Connolly in triple jump. The marathon was the most important event and was won by a Greek named Spiridon Louis.

Olympia is a small village situated near the west coast of the Peloponnese Peninsula of Greece. It is noted for its archaeological ruins which are related to the temples for worship of Greek gods and the ancient Olympic Stadium.
